Edna Clarice Fielding died peacefully at home, May 12, 2016. Born September 20, 1919, in Smethwick, England. Served in the Women's Auxiliary Air Force during World War II. Emigrated to Canada June 1958 with husband Roy and two young daughters. Settled in Trenton, Ontario, area until Roy's death in 1989. Hairdresser, medical secretary, Brown Owl, District Commissioner and trainer of Brownie leaders in the Girl Guides of Canada. Naturally curious, Edna enjoyed all handcrafts. A succession of pets enriched her home – cats, dogs, horses. Her love of singing, literature, nature and animals lives on in her daughters. Survived by her brother Donald Wigley (Veronica) of Oakville. Remembered with love by her daughters, Susan (Eric McNair) and Lynda.
