“ Grandma was proud of her native heritage, something she tried to teach us about at every opportunity. I interviewed her for a grade 12 high school paper, and to this day I am so happy for that because I learned so much about Grandma. Coming from a family of residential school survivors she grew up poor - but thrifty, industrious, determined and smart. She passed down as much of her indigenous teachings and beliefs as she could, while still believing Jesus was her one true savior. She understood truth could be found in more than one religious or political avenues, and taught us not to be tied to anything 150% because every person has unseen colors. Becoming very successful in her adult life, Grandma never wasted a penny - she even emptied her dish water outside so "they couldn't charge her twice". Her signature dish "MusGo's" was all the leftovers of the week put together in whatever kind of meal she'd think of. My funniest memory of Grandma was when I got up in the middle of the night to go to the bathroom at the cottage. I turned on the lights and screamed when I saw her false teeth in a cup on the sink. She came down laughing historically, gums out saying "what you didn't know about my friends?" With a truly infectious laugh, she could make any room laugh historically just by drunk giggling at something - more than once she pee'd her pants at family functions laughing. Grandma always bought us silk pajamas for Christmas and butterscotch lifesavers, she LOVED a good bingo and more than a few times I've heard her say "Show me some pretty ladies" when playing Poker. She loved music and pop culture from her teenage years and she dearly loved her siblings. An accomplished fisherman her and grandpa spent lots of happy times from Alaska to Florida deep sea fishing. She was fun, risqué, and daring. She was the first person to talk to me about LGBT rights and advocated for her brother, who died, till the last time I talked to her. Her family was everything to her and she showed it. I'm glad we got to spend so much time with her during our childhood. Now more than ever I wished I tried to learn her native language that she loved so much and was so proud of. We will all miss you and keep you close to our hearts I know your spirit fly's free as your creator intended
